Plus, lupus flares can lead to inflammation and organ damage.

Our immune system normally helps protect us from infection and disease. But in people with lupus, the immune system attacks the body. These attacks can cause inflammation, which can lead to the symptoms people with lupus experience during flares. And inflammation from lupus flares can cause long-term damage in many parts of the body.

Just one flare

may cause permanent damage to a vital organ.

Approximately 40% of people with lupus will go on to develop lupus nephritis, where lupus causes inflammation and damage to the kidneys. A single lupus nephritis flare could shorten a kidney's lifespan by decades.

Nearly 4 out of 10 people with lupus will develop kidney disease.

Lupus nephritis is a serious complication of lupus, and symptoms are often not apparent in early stages. Be proactive by staying up to date on blood and urine tests, and make sure to tell your doctor if you are having any new or worsening symptoms. It could be a sign that your lupus is active and possibly affecting your kidneys.



Adding BENLYSTA to lupus nephritis treatments can mean:



Less kidney disease activity*

BENLYSTA helped maintain kidney function and reduce protein in the urine.



Less steroids*

BENLYSTA helped reduce the need for rescue medicines such as high-dose steroids (greater than 10 mg/day).

Works differently than standard treatments for lupus.

BENLYSTA is a biologic therapy, not a steroid. It doesn't suppress your entire immune system.



Targets an underlying cause of lupus.

BENLYSTA affects an immune process that can lead to inflammation in people with lupus and lupus nephritis. Adding BENLYSTA to your current treatment plan may help reduce the abnormal immune system activity that can contribute to disease activity in lupus.

 Talk to your healthcare provider about whether to prevent pregnancy while on BENLYSTA. If you choose to prevent pregnancy, you should use an effective method of birth control for at least 4 months after the final dose of BENLYSTA.



You take BENLYSTA with your other lupus or lupus nephritis medicines.

BENLYSTA is prescribed alongside other lupus medications, including corticosteroids (such as prednisone), antimalarials (such as Plaquenil®), and immunosuppressive agents (such as CellCept® or methotrexate). In clinical trials, BENLYSTA was administered with other drugs, such as antihypersentensives, ACE inhibitors, statins, and NSAIDs.

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Ask your doctor if adding BENLYSTA could help you reach your treatment goals.

IV infusion

If you prefer the convenience of receiving BENLYSTA intravenous (IV) infusions, you can do so with the comfort of having a healthcare provider monitor you during and immediately after the infusion.



- have or have had any type of cancer.
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant.

 unborn baby. You should talk to your HCP
 about whether to prevent pregnancy while
 on BENLYSTA. If you choose to prevent
 pregnancy, you should use an effective
 method of birth control while receiving

- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if BENLYSTA passes into your breast milk. You and your HCP should talk about whether or not you should receive BENLYSTA and breastfeed.

Tell your HCP about all medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

What are the possible side effects of BENLYSTA?

BENLYSTA can cause serious side effects including:

- Progressive multifocal leukoencephalopathy (PML). PML is a serious and life-threatening brain infection. Your chance of getting PML may be higher if you are treated with medicines that weaken your immune system, including BENLYSTA. PML can result in death or severe disability. Tell your HCP right away if you notice any new or worsening medical problems such as: memory loss, trouble thinking, dizziness or loss of balance, difficulty talking or walking, loss of vision.
- Cancer. BENLYSTA may reduce the activity of your immune system. Medicines that affect the immune system may increase your risk of certain cancers.
